## **Physical Description**

--Red doughnut-shaped container with top and bottom parts of equal dimensions. The exterior is red lacquer with the top half or cover decorated with running lines of spirals and whirls often called "meander", or thunder and cloud pattern, in gilt. In opposed quadrants there are dragons with only head and tail and a bit of the back showing outside a puff of cloud indicated only by a few lines. In the intervening quadrants, the dragon motif is continued with head facing forward and the magic ball (the sun) in its mouth. Again, only two bits of tail and leg are filled in with scale effect.
